The series has sold worldwide. This led to Carol being invited by UNESCO to help create an Olive Route around the Mediterranean with the intention of bringing nations together through their mutual understanding and experience with the cultivation of this mythical tree.

Carol is also the author of many novels including *An Act of Love*, published by Penguin in 2021. Her latest is *One Summer in Provence* published by Atlantic in July 2025.

Carol presented Channel 5's six-part travel series, *Carol Drinkwater's Secret Provence*. The series hit the TV charts and has been screened worldwide.

She lives in the south of France where she is writing her next novel. She writes articles for many newspapers, blogs regularly about life in France, has a column in the magazine *France Today*, and writes for The History Girls website.

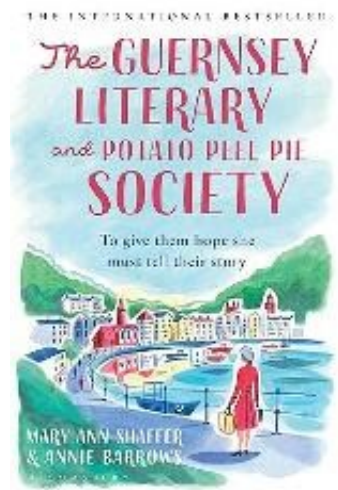

Talk by William Adams - Cezanne at Château Noir

It's not every day that we get a whole new insight into the Cezanne ecosystem. Monday's talk at the AAGP library by William Adams on Cezanne at Château Noir opened up a plethora of stories and influences centred around this famous, oddly named, house on the left side of the road from Aix to Le Tholonet.

Actually, two houses connected together, with an extensive terrain behind that goes all the way up to the Bibémus quarries. Cezanne lived in an apartment there from 1887 to 1902 and painted many of his defining works in and around the property, especially from the promontory La Barre des Rochers.

After his death, the house's benevolent owners, the Tessier family, housed many of the people who were responsible for the resurrection of Cezanne's reputation in Aix, including Erle Loran, John Rewald, Léo Marchutz and André Masson. The house continued through the next seventy years to be an inspirational hub for artists, which continues to this day; one of the former residents was even at our talk, artist and AAGP member Jill Steenhuis.

It was a real 'Champions League' event: Bro Adams is a man who carries his erudition very lightly (no, don't ask me, I don't know why the nickname either but apparently everyone calls him Bro). Despite having had a stellar career in the USA in art history and the humanities, the 60-minute talk was judged perfectly for his AAGP audience. I'd like to think that means it was deeply intellectual and rigorously comprehensive, but really there was plenty of humour, no dry recitation of facts, and the occasional flash of the cute diamond earring in his right ear. As my daughter Holly would say, Respect!

His 2025 book *Cezanne à Château Noir*, co-authored with Thierry Maugenest, available in all the Aix bookshops, has just been awarded the 2025 prize by the Académie des sciences, agriculture, arts et belles-lettres d'Aix.

A last word before I exceed my word count. If you Google 'William Drea Adams', the eighth entry reads "Fine dining in endless conversation with Mr William Drea Adams". Perhaps the AAGP could invite him back for a gourmet lunch?
